THE AMBASSADORS VS THE HURLINGHAM CLUB

The Ambassadors reigned supreme at this year's friendly tennis match between the London Diplomatic Corps and the Hurlingham Club in SW6. Not only did Ambassador to Kazakhstan Erlan Idrissov win the prize for most games, but he led his team to an easy victory. The two teams battled it out just a few days before Rafael Nadal and Maria Sharapova were due to appear in the Aspall Tennis Week at the Club.

Lindsay Smallbone, a former Kiwi diplomat, played for the Diplomats and helped them to their well-earned victory. Both their Excellencies, Nabil Khedher and Rami Mortada, Ambassadors for Tunisia and Lebanon respectively, were wonderfully diplomatic about the British weather – not as hot as they are used to at home, but at least the Hurlingham tea was on a par with the Ritz! His Excellency Erlan Idrissov treated players to champagne, plus various Kazakh delights: caviar, vodka, honey and chocolates. He also presented the Club with a beautiful crystal vase of the Baiterek Tower in Astana.

The Hurlingham Club owes much to the Diplomatic Corps and FCO for helping to stave off the compulsory purchase of the Club back in the 1950s. During World War II, the Club had been used as a meeting place for allied diplomats so the Labour Council was advised that it would not be wise to upset them! Today, the Club has 50 places for Heads of Mission. On submission of an application form, and payment of a full adult subscription, they can become a member. Only three members are currently diplomats, so word needs to get out about the extraordinary peace and quiet and sporting facilities of Hurlingham - as well as the annual tennis match!

VISIT MALAYSIA 2020

On 28 August, at the Malaysian High Commission in Belgrave Square, Malaysia Airlines and Tourism Malaysia launched their latest campaign 'Visit Malaysia 2020.' The event was the first of a series of events surrounding a season of promotions and sales to entice UK tourists to visit one of Asia's most popular holiday destinations known for its beaches, rainforests and cuisine.

Overall, tourism is performing well in 2019, with the number of tourist arrivals to Malaysia increasing by 4.9 per cent to 13.35 million in the first six months of this year. The UK continues to perform as a key market, and ranks the second highest for tourist expenditure per capita, after Saudi Arabia. A Malaysian-style brunch followed the proceedings.



AFGHANISTAN-UK BUSINESS CONFERENCE 2019

The Embassy of Afghanistan and International Chamber of Commerce in Afghanistan will be hosting the second Afghanistan-UK Business Conference on 14 October. The aim of the event is to further enhance trade between Afghanistan and the UK, and unlock potential investment in Afghanistan. Taking place at DLA Piper's offices in the city, the conference will focus on Afghanistan's trade and investment climate, with the theme 'Invest and Protect.' It will also cover commercial opportunities resulting from the 'Regional Initiatives for Afghanistan's Economic Connectivity' programme, plus recent developments in mining and infrastructure, energy, agrobusiness, business arbitration and investment security in Afghanistan.

Attendees will include public and private leaders from Afghanistan and the UK, leaders of international companies, NGOs, think-tanks involved in the formulation of Afghan policy, traders, and other stakeholders involved in nurturing a strong, transparent private sector-led economy in Afghanistan. Speakers at the event include: Ambassador of Afghanistan to the UK Said T Jawad, Abdul Bahman, Secretary General of ICC Afghanistan, Lord Tariq Ahmad, plus various ministers from the Afghanistan government. 200 delegates are expected from over 30 countries. 2019 KOREAN AMBASSADOR'S CUP

Mr Nam Kook Sun, Chargé d'Affaires at the Embassy, opened the Ambassadors Cup 2019 stating: "Korean Martial self-defence technique cultivates the mind, practices manners and trains personality. I hope to continue the bilateral sports exchange between the UK and Korea and help form a foundation to strengthen cooperation in various other areas. The spirit of the championship is to conduct yourself with courtesy, integrity, perseverance, self-control and the indomitable spirit of Taegeuk."







AFGHANISTAN-UK MEDIA Conference

Continuing the work of the FCO Media Freedom Conference, the Embassy in London organised the firstever Afghanistan-UK Media Conference on 12 July. The theme of the conference was 'Afghan Media for Democracy,' aiming to recognise and assess the important role of Afghan journalists and media professionals in promoting rule of law, sustainable development, transparency and accountability in Afghanistan post-9/11. Within the framework of the 26th edition of the World Press Freedom Day celebrations, the event acted as a platform for Afghan media leaders and representatives from the international media industry, journalists, civil society and academia to discuss the current challenges faced by the Afghan media, along with their potential to support the on-going peace and reconciliation processes in Afghanistan. Over 20 journalists - both men and women – attended from Afghanistan, with opening remarks delivered by Minister of State for the Commonwealth and the United Nations Lord Ahmad, and Ambassador Jawad.











PRESIDENT OF COLOMBIA AT CANNING HOUSE

As part of his first official visit to the UK, President of Colombia Iván Duque Márquez gave the Canning Lecture hosted by Canning House on 17 June. The President was introduced by Mark Menzies MP, the UK Prime Minister's Trade Envoy to Argentina, Colombia, Chile and Peru, and Lord Mountevans, Honorary President of Canning House and former Lord Mayor.

Since 1997, the prestigious Canning Lecture has been delivered by visiting Latin American and Iberian Presidents and Heads of Government. Previous speakers include Michelle Bachelet, President of Chile, who gave the Lecture in 2008 and 2016; and Enrique Peña Nieto, President of Mexico in 2015.

VIC CASIM

We were sad to learn that a long-time friend of *Diplomat* magazine, Vicente Ang Casim had passed away on 21 June 2019.

There were three places that Vic (as he was known) would eventually call home: Manila, New York and London. After studying Law, he worked in the banking sector in Manila, before moving to New York in the late 1960s where his career spanned from Wall Street to the UN. In 1993, he moved to London to work at the Philippine Embassy. Appointed Commercial Attaché in 1995, it was at the Philippine Trade and Investment Centre-London, the commercial section of the Philippine Embassy, where Vic made his mark on the diplomatic and business communities in the UK. During his long stint as Commercial Attaché, Vic had fallen in love with London, and continued his service to the Philippine government as Marketing Officer, Consultant and Honorary Investment and Trade Representative.

Vic was a natural diplomat; he enjoyed networking, and helping Philippine businessmen navigate the UK market. He promoted the Philippines with great pride and belief in what the country offered, and he loved engaging with people of all ages, sectors and disciplines. Even after his retirement, Vic continued to assist the team at PTIC-London using his extensive network. Vic's humour, fashion-sense and love of entertaining meant he always remained young in spirit.
